- Numerous requests by Legislators, including audits of appropriations for the Alamo Complex, contracting at the Department of Information Resources, and procurement processes at the Health and Human Services Commission.

Additionally, she supervises and signs the auditor opinion for state agency financial statement audits, including the State of Texas Annual Comprehensive Financial Report.

Prior to working at the State Auditor's Office, Ms. Collier worked as an accountant at various private sector companies in Texas and Oklahoma. In that role, Porter worked closely with ERS on legislation related to state employee benefits, demonstrating a strong commitment to ERS members and retirees, as well as keen knowledge of state government, benefits and budgets. Prior to leading

Duncan's Senate staff, Porter was his legislative assistant when he served in the Texas House of Representatives.

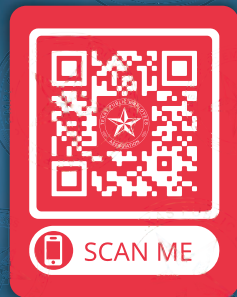

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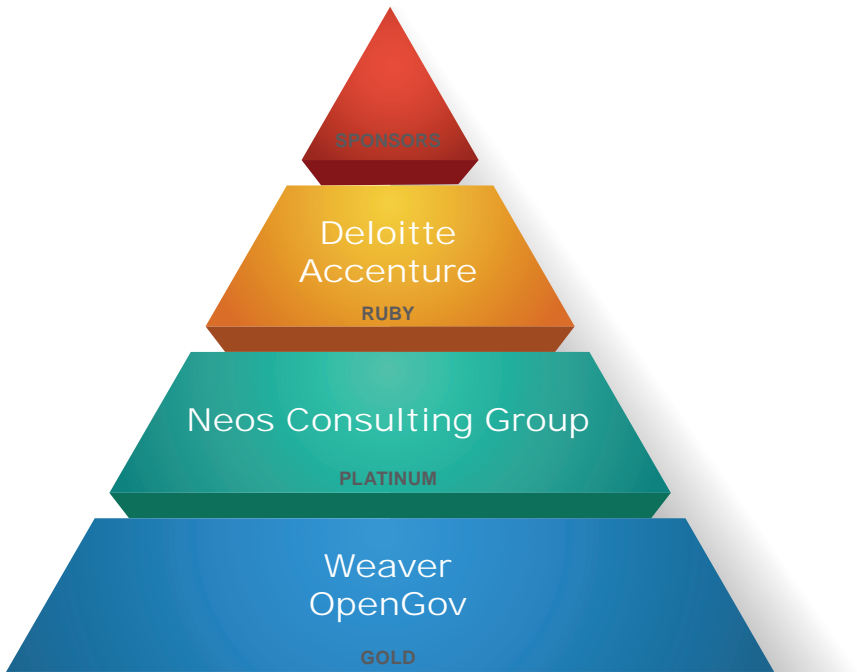
