Mike Arismendez became the Executive Director of the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR) on February 1, 2022. He joined TDLR as the Deputy Executive Director of Administrative Services and Strategic Response on March 26, 2019. Prior to his position, he was appointed by Governor Rick Perry as a Commissioner to TDLR in 2005 and subsequently appointed as Chairman, and was re-appointed by Governor Greg Abbott until 2019, when he became the Deputy Executive Director.

Prior to working at TDLR, he served as City Manager for the City of Littlefield and Mayor of the City of Shallowater. He also held several positions with the City of Lubbock, and as legislative director for State Representative Carl H. Isett.

Mike was appointed by Governor Greg Abbot to the Advisory Council on Cultural Affairs in 2019. He serves on the Federation of State Massage Therapy Boards, the Texas Coordinating Council on Veteran Services, and the Business Executive Leadership Council. Mike served as the Chairman of the Hutto Economic Development Type A and Type B Corporations, as well as Secretary/Treasurer for both the River Creek Development Corporation and Cottonwood Development Corporation, and the City of Hutto Tax Incremental Reinvestment Zone #2 as Chairman. Mike was previously appointed by Governor Rick Perry to the Texas Motor Vehicle Board in 2003. He also served as a member to the Texas Tech Chancellor's Hispanic Enrollment Task Force, President of the Lubbock Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, and on the Board for the Lubbock Chamber of Commerce.

LISA R. COLLIER, CPA, CFE, CIDA

The Legislative Audit Committee appointed Ms. Collier as State Auditor, effective November 1, 2021. Ms. Collier has been responsible for overseeing all work performed by the State Auditor's Office as the Acting State Auditor since January 2016. Ms. Collier is the first female State Auditor for the Texas State Auditor's Office.

Ms. Collier leads a professional staff of approximately 200 auditors and support personnel with an annual budget of \$22 million. She works with the Legislative Audit Committee, members of the Legislature, and executive management for state agencies and institutions of higher education.

During her career with the State Auditor's Office, Ms. Collier has worked on and led many types of audits, investigations, and special projects. Several of the assignments overseen by Ms. Collier have resulted in significant legislative changes. The Legislature has trusted her leadership by assigning the State Auditor's Office several significant projects to complete. Some of those include:

- Performing Contract Monitoring Assessment of Certain State Agencies.
- Developing Reports on the Investigation and Prosecution of Sexual Assaults in Texas.
- An Audit of Correctional Managed Health Care at the University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston and Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center.
- Numerous requests by Legislators, including audits of appropriations for the Alamo Complex, contracting at the Department of Information Resources, and procurement processes at the Health and Human Services Commission.

Additionally, she supervises and signs the auditor opinion for state agency financial statement audits, including the State of Texas Annual Comprehensive Financial Report.

Prior to working at the State Auditor's Office, Ms. Collier worked as an accountant at various private sector companies in Texas and Oklahoma. She has a bachelor's degree in accounting from the University of Central Oklahoma. She is a Certified Public Accountant, Certified Fraud Examiner, Certified Investments and Derivatives Auditor, and a graduate of the 2010 Texas Fiscal Officers' Academy. In addition, Ms. Collier is the Chair of the Southwest Intergovernmental Audit Forum.

Previously he spent nearly 18 years at Texas Monthly, stepping down in August 2009 as the magazine's president and editor in chief. Evan is also the host of "Overheard with Evan Smith," a weekly half-hour interview program that airs on PBS stations around the country. A native of New York, he is a graduate of Hamilton College and Northwestern University's Medill School of Journalism.



STATE REPRESENTATIVE ARMANDO WALLE

State Representative Armando Walle is serving his seventh term in the Texas House of Representatives. First elected in 2008, Representative Walle represents Texas House District 140 which consists of portions of north Houston and unincorporated portions of north Harris county-- including parts of the Northside and Aldine communities, where he grew up, graduated from MacArthur High School, and still resides.

During his time in the Texas Legislature, Representative Walle has worked on many issues important to him and his constituents, with a particular focus on improving the health, safety, and economic well-being of working families. Representative Walle, raised by a single mother and the oldest of 5 children, was the first in his family to attend and graduate from college. The experiences and lessons of his humble upbringing have informed his legislative priorities. Representative Walle has authored a variety of bills toward those priorities, including providing water utility customers recourse for nonexistent water service, helping nursing mothers return to work, establishing Texas' Maternal Mortality and Morbidity Task Force, and the Institute for a Disaster Resilient Texas. His efforts as an elected official

have been instrumental in bringing new clinics to medically underserved areas in House District 140, and building the East Aldine Town Center-- which includes the BakerRipley campus, the Harris County 911 Call Center, and a Lone Star College-North Harris campus.

Representative Walle is currently a member of the House Committee on Appropriations, serving as Chair of the Appropriations Subcommittee on Articles VI, VII, VII (natural resources, business & industry, and regulatory entities). Representative Walle, in his work on the House Appropriations committee, has sought to broaden access to healthcare by providing more resources to and protecting the state's women's health programs while fighting perennial efforts to erode safety net programs crucial to so many children and families across the state. In his service on the Article VI, VII, VIII subcommittee, he has worked to bolster our state's water supply while also increasing our flood readiness statewide. He also serves as a member of the House Committees on House Administration and Natural Resources. The charges of these committees are more important than ever in the 87th session as the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic continues to impact Texans.

Representative Walle has previously also served on the House Committees on Energy Resources, Human Services, Business & Industry, Insurance, Higher Education, Redistricting, as well as the Appropriations Subcommittees on Article II (health and human services agencies) and Article III (public and higher education), and others.

Representative Walle is a member of a number of legislative caucuses, including the Mexican-American Legislative Caucus, for which he serves on the board as Treasurer. He is also a member of the House Democratic Caucus, Women's Health Caucus, and LGBTQ Caucus.

Before Representative Walle was elected to the Texas House, he served on the staff of multiple elected officials, including Congressman Gene Green and Congresswoman Sheila Jackson Lee, where he led different community projects including Immunization Day, Paying for College workshops and senior citizen issue forums. Now a practicing attorney, Representative Walle earned his bachelor's and law degree from the University of Houston.

In his free time, State Representative Walle enjoys spending time with his family-- his wife, Debbie Walle, a Texas Women's University graduate, and their two young sons-- frequently celebrating and lamenting the ups and downs of his beloved University of Houston Cougars, Houston Astros, Houston Texans, and Houston Rockets..

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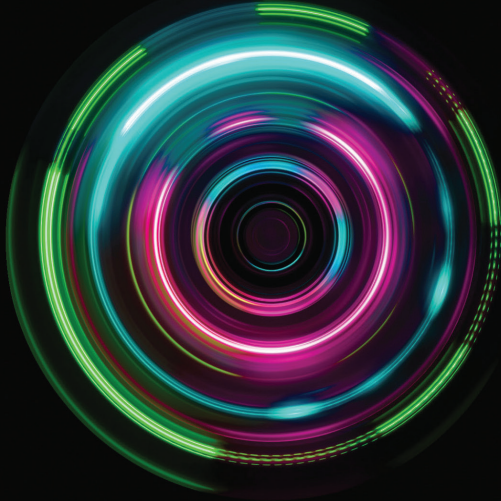
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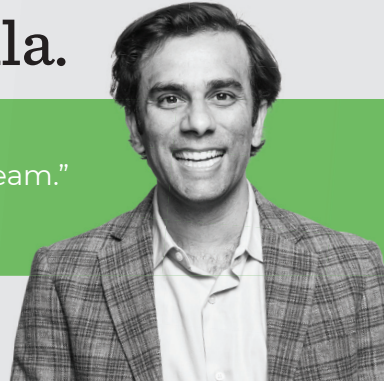

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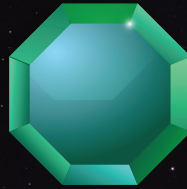
