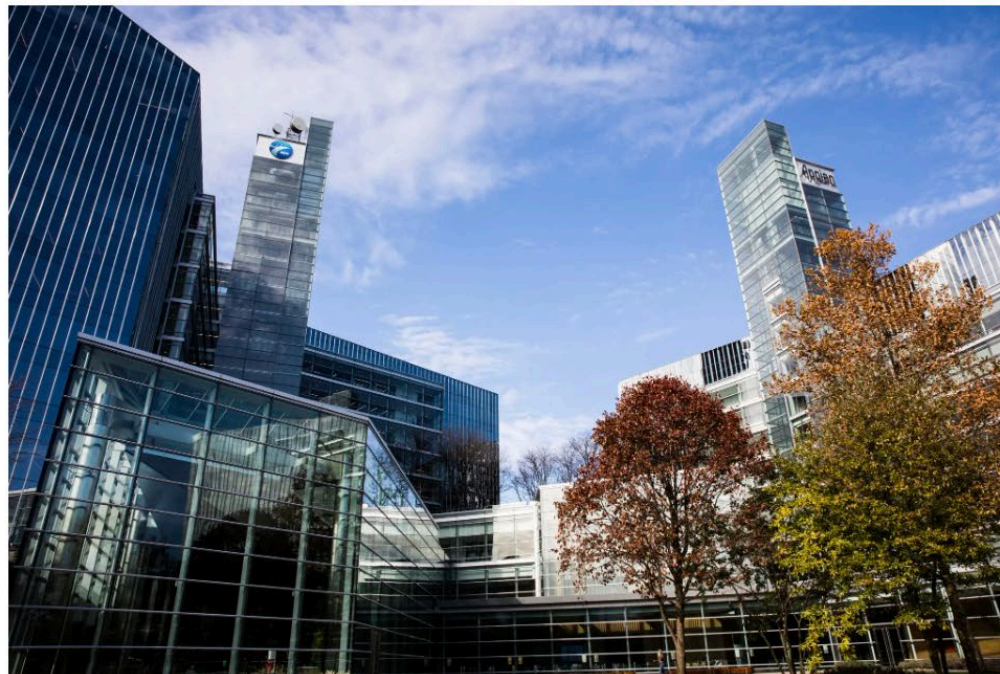

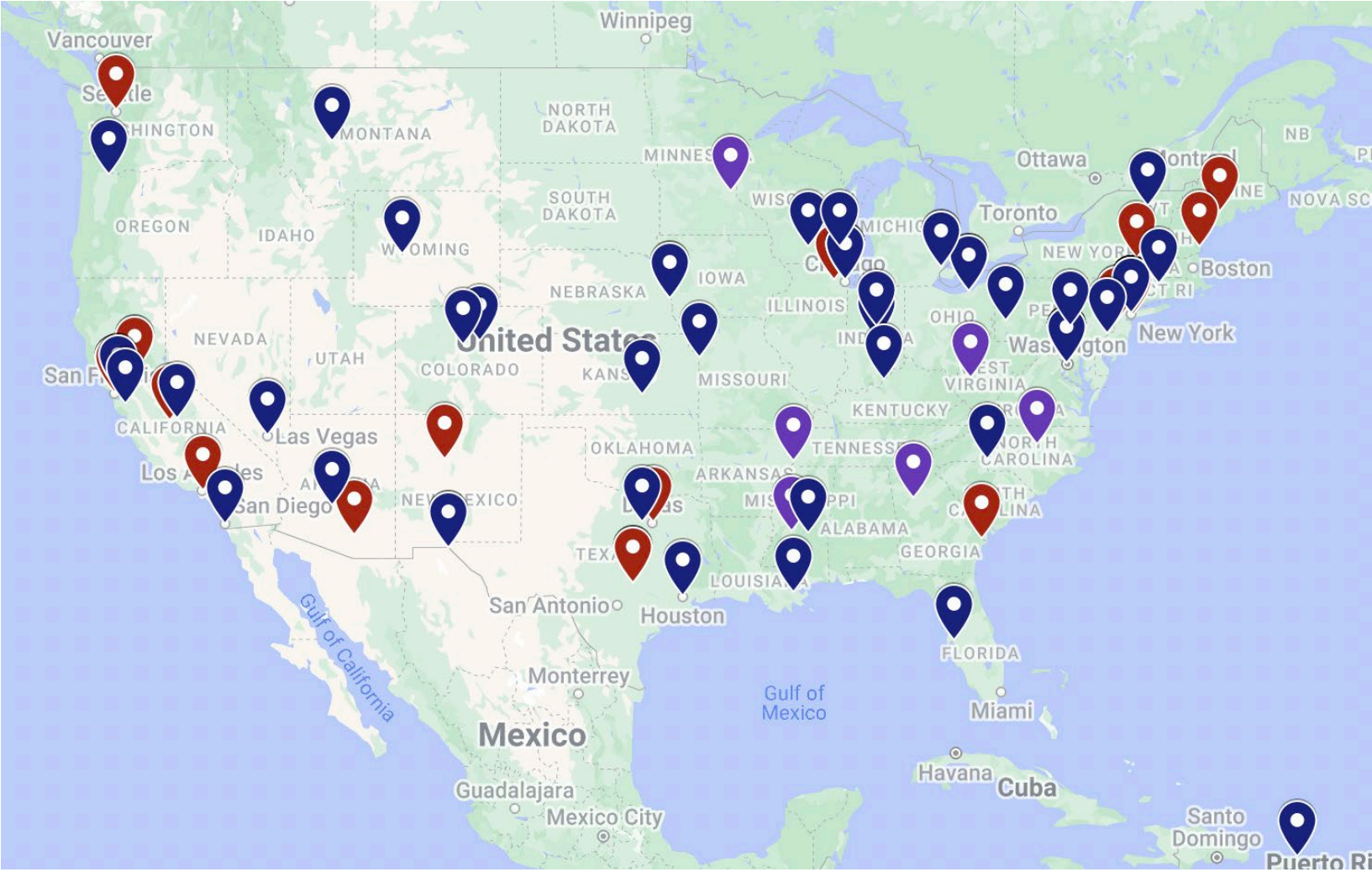

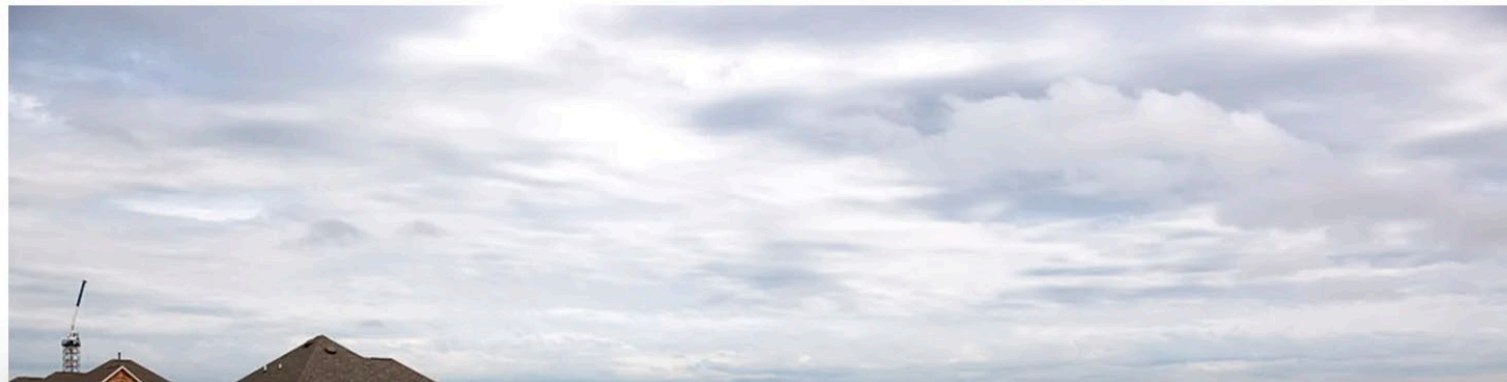

A PREMIUM PRODUCT OF  THE TEXAS TRIBUNE

- About \$12.6 billion will go toward reducing the school property tax rate by 10.7 cents per \$100 valuation for homeowners and business properties.
- The homestead exemption for homeowners will increase from \$40,000 to \$100,000.
- There will be a three-year, 20% cap on appraisal increases for commercial and non-homesteaded properties valued at \$5 million or below. (That figure could change yearly depending on inflation.)
- Cuts are coming to franchise taxes for small businesses.
- Any county with 75,000 or more residents will also receive three more members on its appraisal district's board of directors. Those new members will be elected in nonpartisan elections.

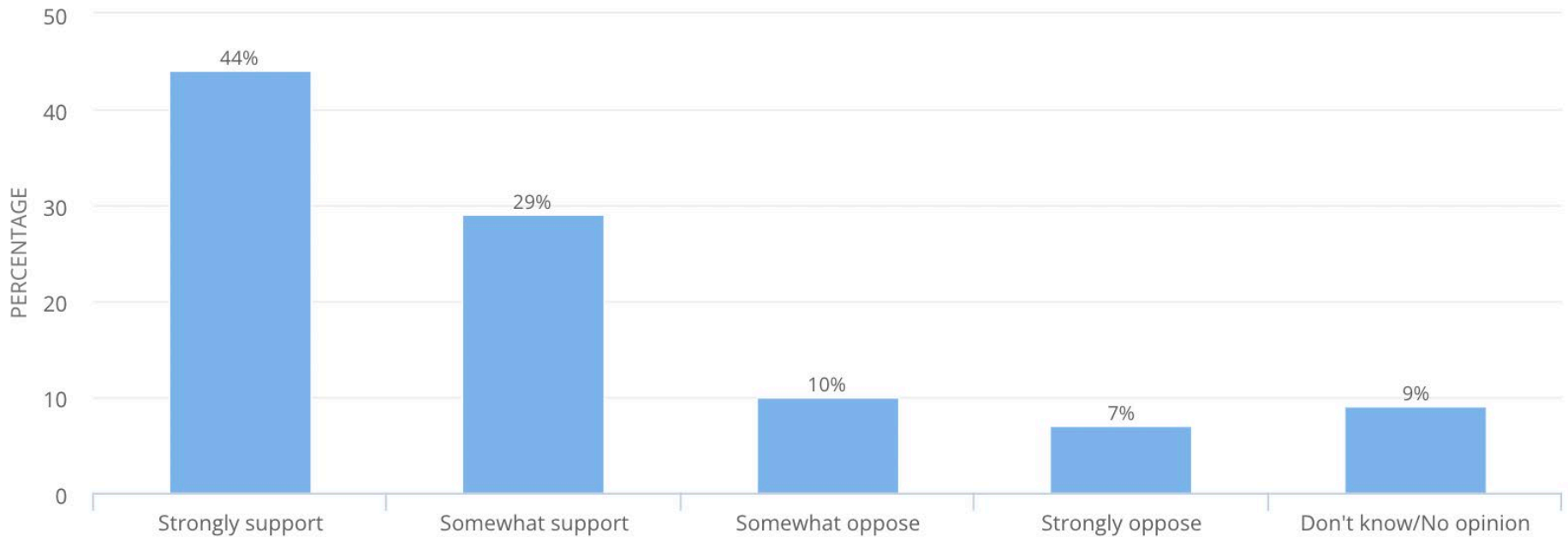

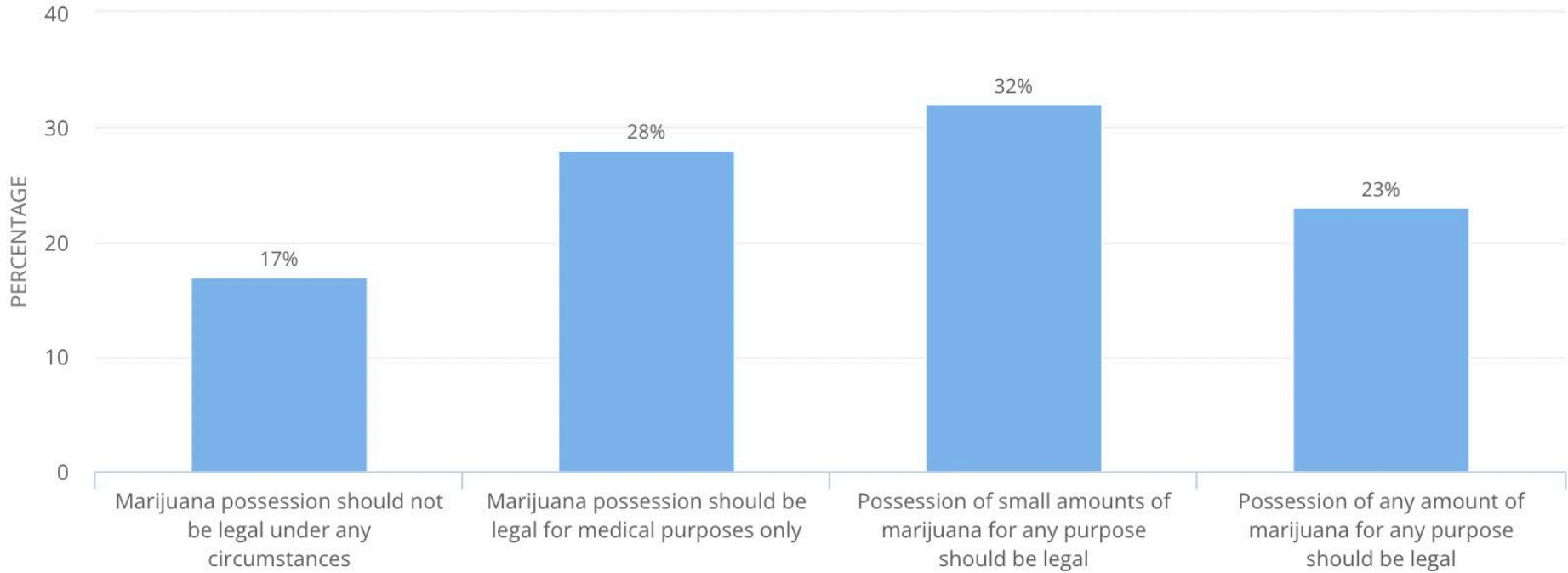

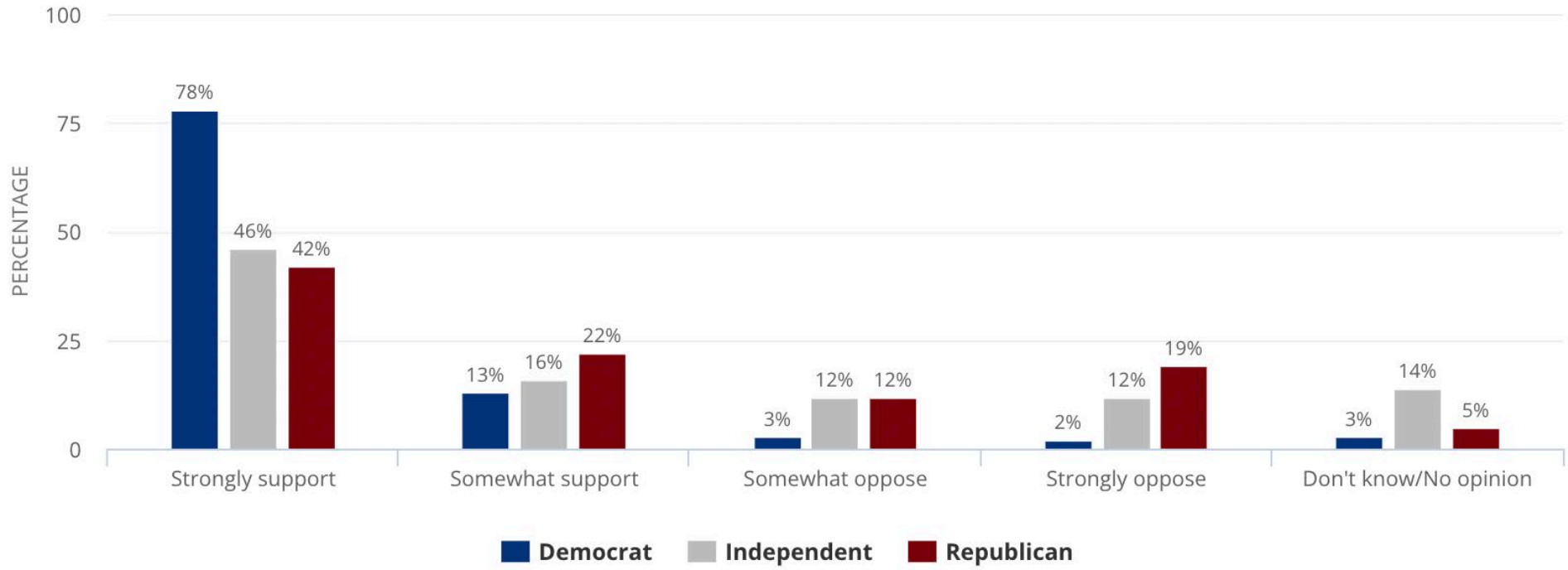

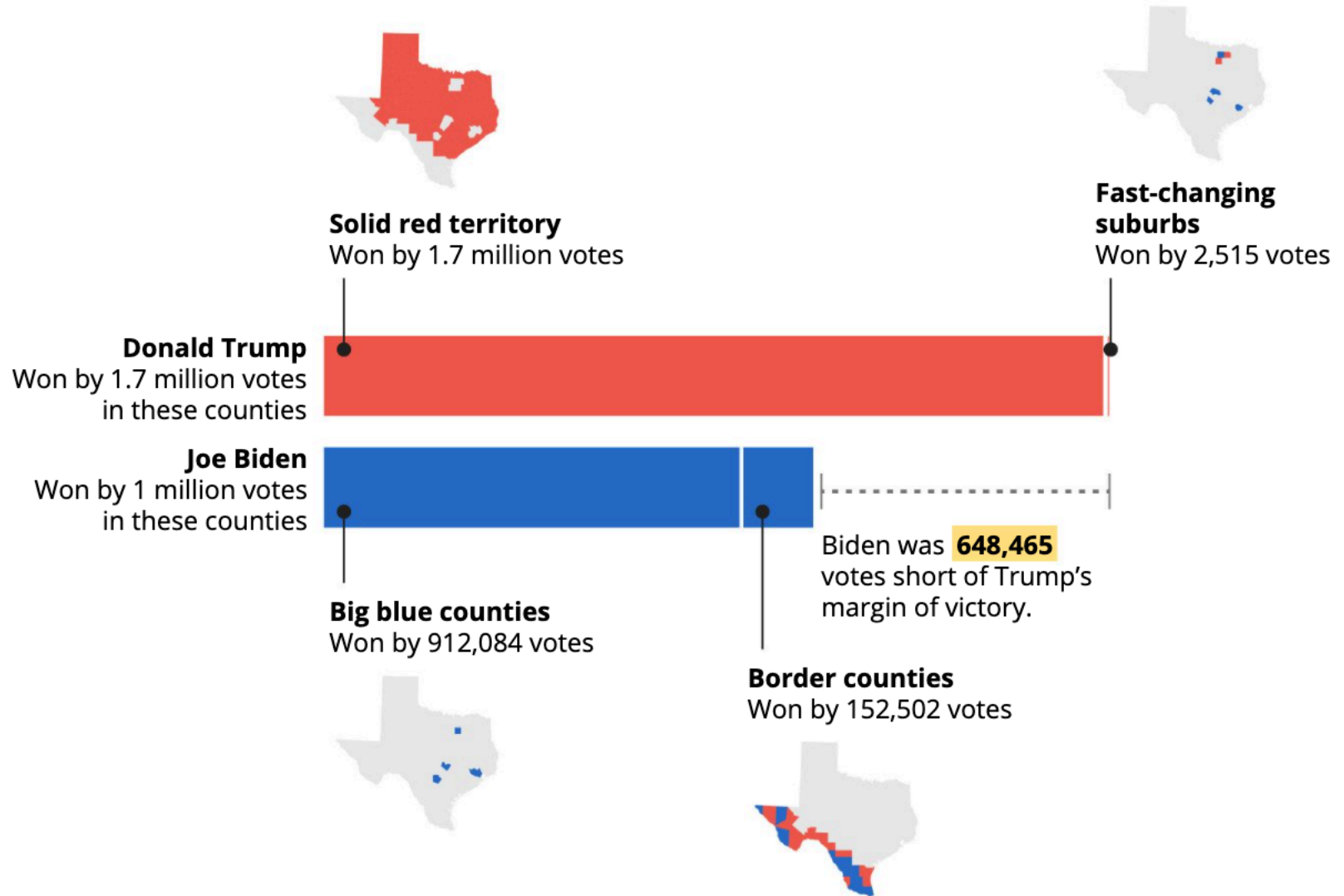

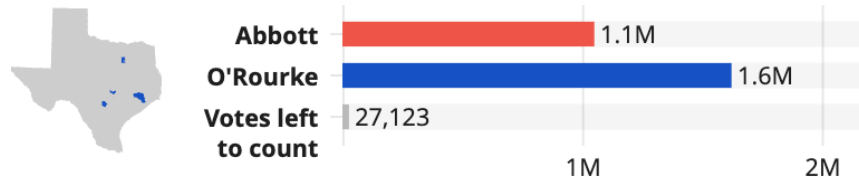

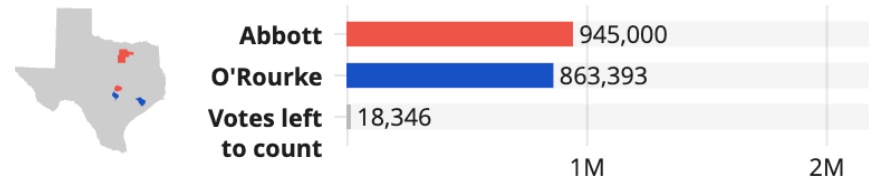

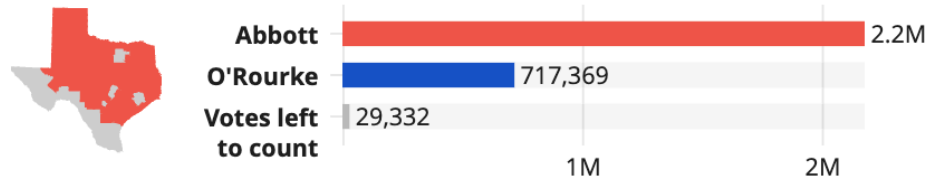

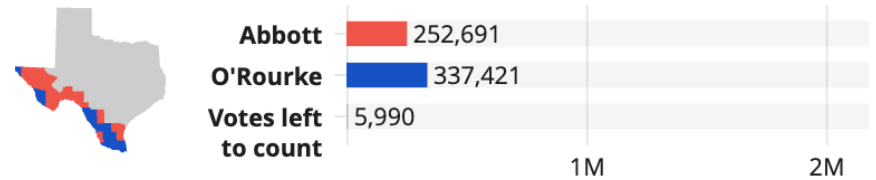

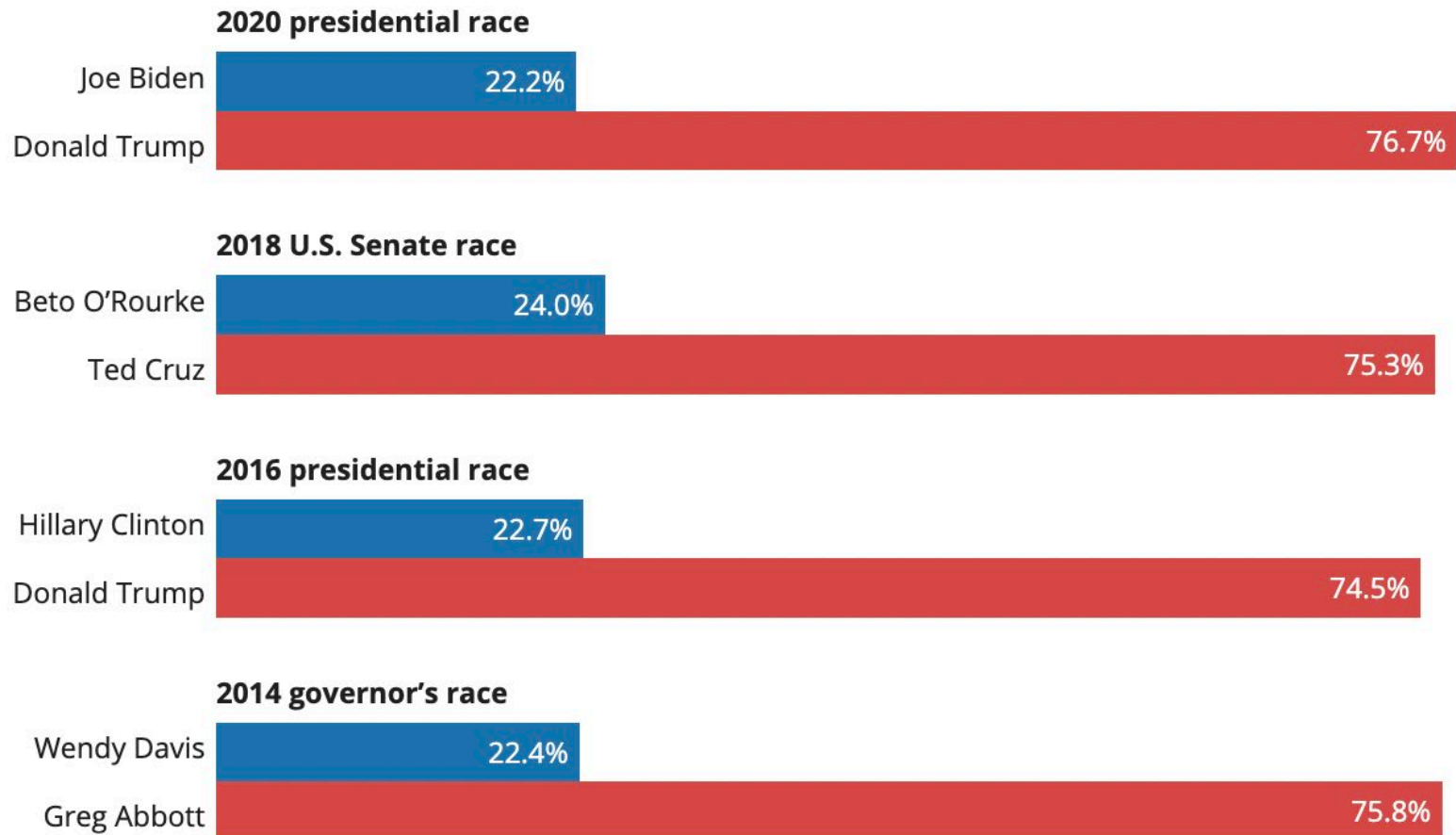

Less than a quarter of rural Texas voters favor Democrats in elections

Among Texas voters living in the state's 186 rural counties, the percentage who voted for Democrats in top ballot races has hovered around 20% over the last couple of elections. When Beto O'Rourke ran for U.S. Senate, he received about 24% of the votes among rural counties.
